

Note: If any activity of admission process falls on a Gazetted Holiday/Sunday in ibid scheduled it will be shifted to next working day. However, adjustment on this account will be made by curtailing orientation/ post admission counseling period accordingly.

Important Guidelines and Eligibility Criteria for Admission to Under-Graduate Courses—B.A., B.Com. and B.Sc.-I

 For admission: A student who has passed in the Senior Secondary (10+2) Examination (Academic Stream) conducted by the H.P. Board of School Education or an examination accepted as equivalent thereto by the H.P. University. Provided that the candidates who have passed the qualifying examination with science stream shall be given preference in admission to B.Sc. /B.C.A. programme. Provided that the candidates who have passed the qualifying examination with commerce stream shall be given preference in admission to B.Com. programme. Provided that the candidates who have passed the qualifying examination with Mathematics as one of the subject shall be given preference in admission to B.Sc./B.C.A. programme. A student, who has passed 10+2 examination or an equivalent course, can get admission in the 1st year of 'Three Year Degree' Course of B.A., B.Sc., B.Com. encompassing a total of three years if he/she fulfills the eligibility conditions are given below:

The minimum percentage for admission in various classes is as under:-

B.A.-1st year: 33% (however, a student can opt for Mathematics in B.A. 1st year only if he/she has studied it in 10+2 and has obtained 45% marks in Mathematics or 45% marks in aggregate).

B.Com- 1^{st} year: 45% (however it is 40% for those who have passed 10+2 from Commerce stream and for girl candidates it is 33%).

B.Sc.-1st year: 45% (a relaxation of 5% of marks is given to SC/ST candidates).

For determining the percentage 0.5 and above shall be considered as one.

A candidate seeking admission to B.Sc.-1st year must have studied Physics, Chemistry, Biology or Mathematics and English at 10+2 level.

A candidate seeking admission to B.Com.-1st year must have studied Commerce/Mathematics/Economics as compulsory subjects at 10+2 level.

A candidate who has not appeared/passed English as subject at 10+2 level shall not be eligible for admission to B.A.- 1^{st} year.

A candidate having passed 10+2 examination in four subjects (including English as one of the compulsory subjects) from any Indian University/Board recognized by law can seek admission.

Admission is open to an applicant who has any degree from a foreign university (Recognized by AIU (All India Universities) of H.P. University Shimla.

If a candidate is placed under compartment in 10+2 or in an equivalent examination, he/she will not be allowed to take admission.

A student who has passed 10+2 from vocational stream or computers will be given admission in B.A./B.Com. 1st year only.

A student with result R.L./R.L.(U.M.C.)/C.S. wil not be given admission in college.

Limited numbers of students (80/140) will be admitted in each DSC-I course.

Roaster system will be followed for admission in 1st year of B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. and M.A.

First merit list of candidates along with waiting list (those who applied for admission in a particular DSE-I subject

will be displayed on the college notice board and he/she has to deposit admission fee within the given particular date & time

Important

If a candidate fails to deposit admission fee within a particular date and time, he/she will not be considered as admitted in his/her opted DSC-I subject. Also his/her candidature on preparation of second merit list (in case of vacancy) shall stand cancelled and candidate in waiting list will be considered for admission on the fulfillment of above conditions.

Documents Required With The Admission Form For B.A./B.Com/B.Sc. 1st Year :

- 1. Two passport size photographs.
- 2. Self-attested photocopy of Matriculation Certificate.
- 3. Self-attested photocopy of 10+2 Certificate. Internet copy will not be valid.
- 4. Character Certificate.
- 5. School/college- Leaving Certificate.
- 6. Migration Certificate for candidates who do not belong to H.P. Board/University.
- 7. Self-attested photocopy of ST/SC/OBC/Sports/Culture/Handicapped/IRDP
- 8. BPL Certificate for those seeking relaxation in age/marks/fee etc.
- 9. Self-attested photocopy of Bonafide Himachali Certificate (for girls only).
- 10. Photo copy of Aadhaar card.
- 11. Print copy of anti-ragging undertaking uploaded on UGC website <u>www.antiragging.in</u> or <u>www.amanmovement.org</u>.

Documents Required For Admission To B.A./B.COM/B.SC. 2ND & 3RD YEAR :

- 1. Certificate of the latest passed examination.
- 2. Self-attested photocopy of registration Certificate.
- 3. Character Certificate in case of migrating candidates.
- 4. SC/ST/OBC/IRDP/BPL certificate for migrating candidates.
- 5. Bonafide Himachali certificate for migrating girl student.

Admission through Migration:

- 1. A student wishing to migrate to T.S.Negi Govt. College Reckong Peo will be allowed only when seats are vacant in the DSC/DSE-1 subject and subject combination available.
- 2. A migrating student must fill up a prescribed Performa; get the consent of teachers and principal of his/her college and the college he/she wishes to migrate.
- 3. If permission is granted, two photocopies of migration certificate are to be submitted in the migrated college. One of these would be forwarded to the old college.
- 4. A migrating student has to submit the following documents with the migration certificate:
- 5. Lecture attendance issued by his/her subject teachers (old college).
- 6. Statement of credit earned under CCA.
- 7. Original Character Certificate from the Principal of college last attended.
- 8. Admission will be given during the time period provided by the H.P. University.
- 9. A student migrating to T.S.Negi Govt. College Reckong Peo shall have to pay admission-fee afresh, but the monthly fee will be charged from the month of joining in the college.
- 10. A student migrating from a private college will also pay the annual fee.

Refusal of Admission

A student who fails in two subjects or fails twice in a class will not be admitted to that class. However, if he/she opts to change the faculty, he or she may be admitted in the 1st year of the changed new faculty, if otherwise eligible.

- a. A candidate expelled by any college/university or found involved in in disciplinary activities in the preceding year (s) will not be admitted in the college.
- b. A candidate having a stay of more than 4 years at any college will not be admitted.
- c. The students failed or having a re-appear from other institutions will not be admitted in the college.
- d. As there is no provision of compartment in the National Open School New Delhi rules, therefore a candidate failing in any one or more than one subject out of five is not eligible for admission. Only pass candidates of NIOS and SOS (State Open School, Dharamshala) will be admitted if otherwise eligible.
- e. Any candidate who has not appeared/passed in English as a subject at 10+2 level shall not be eligible for admission in BA-I.

- f. A candidate who has passed intermediate from Hindi Sahitya Samelan, Allahabad or Prabhakar is not eligible for admission.
- g. If a student gets admission by furnishing incorrect information or by concealing the facts, his/her admission will be cancelled on detection of such fault by the college/university.
- h. In spite of the eligibility for admission, he Principal can refuse admission if the conduct of a student has not been up to the mark during previous years.
- i. The Principal reserves the right to reject or cancel the admission of any student without assigning any reason (s) or explanations if situation warrants so.

Choice Based Credit System (CBCS)

Choosing Program Study Courses

The CBCS provides an opportunity for students to choose courses from the prescribed courses comprising core, elective or skill based courses. The courses can be evaluated following the grading system. The UGC has introduced uniform grading system in entire higher education in India, the cumulative grade point average(CGPA) based on students performance in examination, UGC has formulated the guidelines to be followed

Outline of Choice Based Credit System

- a. Compulsory Course: A course, which should compulsorily be studied by a candidate as a core requirement is termed as a Compulsory Course such as Eng/Hindi/Sanskrit(one either of two)
- b. DSC: Discipline Specific Core, is the core course which a candidate has to study throughout the degree course in Humanities/Science/Commerce.
- c. Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Elective courses may be offered by the main discipline/subject of study is referred to as Discipline Specific Elective (to be offered by main discipline/subject of study) and may be considered very specific or specialized or advanced or supportive to the discipline/ subject of study or which provides an extended scope or which enables an exposure to some other discipline/subject/domain or nurtures the candidate's proficiency/skill
- d. Ability Enhancement Courses: The Ability Enhancement (AE) Courses may be of two kinds: Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course (AECC) and Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC). AECC courses (two) are the courses based upon the content that leads to knowledge enhancement. These are [(i) Environmental Science, (ii) English & Hindi/Sanskrit Language] are mandatory for all disciplines.
- e. SEC courses (minimum two) are value-based and/or skill-based and are aimed at providing hands-on- training, competencies, skills, etc.
- f. An Undergraduate degree in Humanities/ Social Sciences/ Commerce may be awarded if a student completes 4 core papers each in two disciplines of choice (DSC), 2 core papers each in English and Hindi/Sanskrit (CC), respectively, 2 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC), minimum 4 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), 2 papers each from a list of Discipline Specific Elective (DSE)papers based on the two disciplines of choice selected above, respectively, and two papers from the list of Generic Electives (GE) papers.
- g. An undergraduate degree in Science disciplines may be awarded if a student completes 4 core papers each in three disciplines of choice, 2Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC), minimum 4Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) and 2 papers each from a list of Discipline Specific Elective papers based on three disciplines of choice selected above, respectively.
- h. B.A/ B.Sc with a particular subject would require a student to study Skill Enhancement Course of that subject (SEC's) in third year.

CBCS Three Year Degree Course

Pass Course Credit for B.A/B. Sc/B.Com will be 132 Credits; Honor Course Credit for B.A/ B. Sc/ B.Com will be 148 Credits. The B.A student has to choose two Discipline Specific Courses (DSC) out of the subject combinations available and the B.Sc Students have to choose three (DSC) out of the subject combinations available.

Compartment case is allowed if a candidate is unable to pass in two subjects. The Pass Percentage is 40% in each subject including internal assessment.

Subject Combination

The students seeking admission in 1^{st} year degree course are directed to choose one main subject from column of DSC 1(with two papers DSC1A and 1B) and choose second subject from DSC2 column(with two papers DSC2A and 2B), AECC I Environment Science is compulsory and choice of AECC II is between English or Hindi.

Humanities

Three subject pools have been formulated for humanities stream in which a student can choose a DSC 1 from subject pool A,B Or C and DSC II from other two subject pools but two DSC's cannot be chosen from a single subject pool with an exception of sociology where a student can choose Hindi/ Sanskrit as DSC II from same subject pool.

Examination and Evaluation System

Annual system of examination was introduced by H.P. University Shimla from the academic session 2018-2019. The total credits for the pass course at Under-graduate level is 132 and for Honours course at Under-graduate level is 148.

CCA and Term: End examinations will be 70% in theory and 30% in CCA for Arts and Commerce where Practicals are not involved. For Sciences and the subjects/courses where practicals are involved, it will be 50% in theory, 20% in practicals and 30% in CCA.

Accountings for 30% of the final grade that the student gets in a course.

Annual Examination

Accounting for the remaining 70% of the final grade that the students get in a course.

Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA) This would have the following components:

Classroom Attendance: Each student will have to attend a minimum of 75% Lectures/Tutorial/Practicals. A student having less than 75% attendance will not be allowed to appear in the annual examination.

Provided that those having between 74% and 65% attendance will apply for exemption in a prescribed form accompanied by clear reasons for absence to the authorized functionaries.

Provided that those having between 64% and 50% attendance will apply for exemption in a prescribed form accompanied by a medical certificate from a government hospital.

Provided that exemption from 75% attendance will be given to those participating in co-curricular activities (e.g. NCC, NSS, Youth festivals, Sports etc.) to the extent of 25% (making the necessary as 50% in these cases). However, the claim for this exemption should be supported by authenticated certificate from the concerned college authorities.

Provided further that those getting the exemptions, except for those getting exemptions for cocurricular activities will not be entitled for getting the CCA marks for classroom attendance as given below:

Classroom Attendance Incentive:

The criteria for awarding marks for attendance in CCA will be as under:

\geq 75% but < 80%	1 mark
\geq 80% but < 85%	2 marks
\geq 85% but < 90%	3 marks
\geq 90% but < 95%	4 marks
\geq 95%	5 marks

House test/class test/ mid-term test:

The pattern of tests for B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. I, II & III year will be as under:

Class test = 5 marks, House test = 10 marks

House stest and class test will be held in Oct./Nov. 2023.

Seminar/Assignment /Term paper (All UG Glasses)

10 marks of the CCA will be awarded by the subject teachers (each paper) on basis of seminar/assignment and term paper.

Annual Examinations:

The remaining grade of the student in a course will be on the basis of Annual exams that will be for three hours covering the whole syllabus of the course. The annual examination of B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. will be held in March/April 2023.

Minimum pass marks will be 40% in aggregate. However, 35% each in Internal Assessment and Final Examination will be compulsory. For Practicals- 40% pass marks will be compulsory and if a candidate fails to obtain 40% marks in practicals, he/she will be treated as fail in that subject. A candidate failing in either one or two subjects/papers, will be given compartment in that subject (s)/ Paper (s) and will be eligible for promotion to the next class. He/she will have two chances (one at the supplementary stage and one at the annual stage) available to him/her to clear the compartment. He/she will not be awarded the degree until he/she clears all papers/ courses within 5 years from the date of his/her admission to a particular course. A candidate failing in three or more subjects/papers will be treated as fail in that year and has to repeat the entire year.

The success of a candidate will be classified on the combined results of the part-I, II, III examination as follows:

First division – 60% marks or more in aggregate

Second division – 50% marks but less than 60% Third division – less than 50% Revaluation shall be applicable as per provision of H.P. University ordinance for annual system.

Determining GPA, SGPA and CGPA, Division and Merit position for Medals etc.

For each student the Grade Point Average (GPA) and the Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) will be determined by the COE office of the HPU as follows:

GPA or CGPA = $(\sum CiGi)/(\sum Ci)$

Where 'i' is summed over the number of courses studied in the current year. GPA or CGPA = (S Ci Gi)/(S Ci). Where 'I' here is summed over the number of courses studied in the past years as well as current year. 'Ci' is the credit earned for course and 'Gi' is the grade.

At the completion of the UG programme the CGPA will be determined for the following three parts separately:

Part I -Ability & Enhancement Courses.

Part II-Skill & Enhancement Courses.

Part III-Core Courses and Elective Courses.

In each of these parts, the candidate will be categorized as below:

GUIDELINES AND ADMISSION RULES FOR MASTER'S DEGREE (M.A.)

The college offers Post-graduate courses in the subjects of History and Political Science. The number of seats in each subject (per semester) are 40. General Rules:

- 1. An applicant who has got compartment in B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. III examination is not eligible for admission the Master's Degree in the subject in which he/she has been placed in compartment.
- 2. A student who has attained the age of 26 years for boys & 28 years for girls as on 1st July, 2022 (upper age limit is raised to 29 years for SC/ST candidates). The Vice-Chancellor shall have the power to permit age relaxation up to a maximum period of 6 months for reasons to be recorded in writing. However, the age bar shall not apply in the case of candidates in service nominated by the government of H.P.
- 3. A candidate who fails in 1st semester may be permitted to join 2nd semester but he/she shall not be permitted to proceed for 1st semester to 3rd semester without appearing the examination.
- 4. At the time of 1st semester examination, the candidate may appear along with the 2nd semester papers (if the university rules otherwise permit), but the student shall not be permitted to proceed from 3rd semester to the 4th semester without appearing the examination.
- 5. The admission of a student migrating from another university shall be treated as provisional and shall be confirmed only when he/she produces the migration certificate and character certificate from the Head of the institution last attended.
- 6. The admission will be made purely on merit except where otherwise mentioned, subject to the number of seats available and the reservation as per university rules/roster as per the HPU Letter no.-1-58/2016 HPU(DS) for admission in PG classes. HPU Shimla will conduct centralized entrance test. After declaration of the result, students will have to apply accordingly in the college of their choice.

Preference in the admission will be given to candidates who have appeared in entrance tests of M.A. History and Political Science conducted by H.P. University. In case of vacancy, college will conduct an entrance test and eligible candidates will be offered admission. If eligible candidates do not seek admission the the stipulated dates, candidates from waiting list will be called for admission.

Eligibility Conditions:

M.A.Candidates who have passed B.A./B.Sc./B.Com/B.Sc. (Gri), B.Sc. (Home Science), B.Sc. (Engg.), M.B.B.S./Ba.A.M.S./G.A.M.S/B.Pharma/B.T. or B.Ed./B.Lib.Sc./Vashistha Degree of a university established by law in India with at least second division (50% marks) in aggregate or 45% marks or Honors in the subject in which admission to M.A. class is sought, are eligible. Relaxation of 5% marks in minimum eligibility to admission is given to the SC/ST candidates.

the students will be informed through notice board. Information regarding the term/time period of fees are following:

Six monthly fees will be taken during the day of admission.

Remaining six month fees and university examination fees will be taken during the month of October.

General fine will be taken before End Semester Examinations.

Fees should be paid on the decided date otherwise students name will be struck off and he/she will have to take readmission only after paying Rs. 100/- fine.

A student who leaves the college Mid-session, their fees and other funds will not be refunded.

Scholarship for ST, SC and OBC:

- (a) The students belonging to ST or SC categories having their parent's annual income below 2.50 lakh rupees are eligible to apply for the scholarship.
- (b) Students who belong to OBC and whose parent's annual income is Rs.1 lakh or below are eligible to apply for the scholarship.
- (c) Students who belong to BPL and IRDP families are also eligible for IRDP scholarship

Fees for Persons with Disability:

The applicants with more than 40% physical disability will get relaxation in tuition fees. The applicant has to submit Medical Certificate from a competent authority and it should be attached to the admission form. In case of siblings studying in college under the same session/year, tuition fees of one will be exempted.

Girl's Hostel



The college has a girl's hostel with an accommodation for 60 girls. Resident girls' are residing in the hostel since August 2015; the warden of the hostel is Dr. Sideshwari. The hostel is located near the college campus and is well furnished for a comfortable stay of the students. In current academic session a total of 35 students shall be admitted to the hostel strictly on the basis of academic merit the students must adhere to the rules and instructions provided as under:

General Rules of Hostel:-

A student can apply to hostel after being granted admission in the college. The Admission forms can be availed from (College office) Sh. Ram Krishan Hostel clerk. No ragging, smoking, drinking is allowed in the hostel, if a girl is found guilty she shall be expelled from the hostel without any prior notice. The recommendation of warden is necessary for admission in the hostel. A failed student shall not be allowed re-admission in the hostel. Fresh admission needs to be sought every academic semester/year. Any rules which may be deemed necessary by the Principal/Warden according to circumstance shall be observed by the students failing to do so may result in fine/expulsion from the hostel. The Hostel schedule shall follow the College schedule in every manner Security will not be refunded for the students who leave the Hostel mid -session. Married Girls are not permitted to take admission in the hostel.

- 1. Hostel Prefect shall be deputed by Warden for one academic session, having the responsibly of discipline maintenance, conduct of boarders and shall act as representative of the boarders.
- 2. A co-operative mess and (not diet based mess) is being managed by the boarders; resident girls shall manage the mess on rotation. It is compulsory for all the boarders to join the hostel mess and be mess managers.
 - a. No visitors shall be allowed in the hostel premises without permission of authorities/warden.
 - b. The hostel rules/fees are subject to change/revision and students will have to pay the revised fee structure.
 - c. Wardens and lady official from the institute can visit any room at any time for checking.
 - d. Students are not allowed to make union or community based on caste, religion or region.
 - e. Students should register their names in entry register while going outside.
 - f. Any act of ragging, gambling, substance abuse, alcohol consumption, or damaging/defacing hostel property is strictly prohibited and will result in disciplinary action.
- 3. The parents of the boarders are always welcomed for valuable suggestions and visits to the hostel.

Identity Card

- 1. Every student is directed to fill the college identity card immediately after their admission in the college.

- 5. It is the personal responsibility of every student to keep his/her identity card in safe custody; college will not be responsible for any misuse of one's identity card.

Tutorials

Library

Library Rules/Book Bank

- 1. During the regular working days library will remain open from 10:00am to 5:00 pm.
- 2. At one time a student can issue two books for 15 days. If any student wants to re-issue the issued book even after 15days he/she can re-issue only after returning it first. He/she can issue the book for third time after taking permission from the Principal.
- 3. If any student does not return the book after the given duration he/she will be charged fine of one rupee per day.
- 4. If Library ID Card is lost, student can re-issue duplicate library ID card after paying Rs. 20/- fine.
- 5. In case of losing a library book, student has to pay the amount written on the book or he/she have to get the same book as compensation. If library security fees are not withdrawn on time/decided time, it will not be refunded.
- 6. Reference book will not be issued.

Without ID card no students will enter the library. The College library is now connected to INFLIBNET i.e N-List National Library and Information Service Infrastructure for Scholarly Content, which provides access to e- resources to colleges across India, making library digitally connected. The main objective is to share information resources amongst the libraries of academic and research institutes.

RAGGING : A PUNISHABLE OFFENCE

PROHIBITION OF RAGGING UNDER H.P. EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTION ACT

(PROHIBITION OF RAGGING ACT ,2009) defines 'Ragging ' as doing any act, by disorderly conduct, to a student of an educational institution ,which causes or is likely to cause physical or psychological harm or raising apprehension or fear or shame or embarrassment to the student.

Such disorderly conduct includes, teasing or abusing or playing practical jokes on or causing hurt to such students or asking a student to do any act or perform something which such student ,will not be willing to do in the ordinary course. A student who commits the offence of ragging shall be punishable with a imprisonment for a term which may extend to three years or shall also be liable to the fine which may extend Rs.50,000/- or both. If a student is convicted of the charges of committing, abetting, participating or propagating ragging, he shall be dismissed from the college and such student will not get admission in any other college for a period of three years from the date of his dismissal from the college
